Rejecting American Military Involvement in Syria

WHEREAS, the conflict in Syria is a civil war, with atrocities being committed by both sides, and with a barbaric government opposing a rebel force that includes many Al-Qaeda terrorists; and

WHEREAS, there is no definitive evidence to connect the chemical weapons attack to one of the sides involved in the civil war; and

WHEREAS, neither the country of Syria, nor its military, nor its people have shown a direct threat to the security of the United States; and

WHEREAS, there is a true threat due to American involvement that the conflict may expand to other nations, such as our allies Israel and Jordan, and may bring action against us by Iran; and

WHEREAS, the President has presented no clear objective or plan despite multiple speeches and has given ample time to Syria to prepare for any possible American attack; and

WHEREAS, the American people in bipartisan agreement have strongly voiced their rejection of any move towards war by our President and Congress;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Republican Party of Texas rejects proposals to entangle American forces in the Syrian civil war; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Congressional delegation from Texas and to GOP organizations inside and outside of Texas as the Chairman deems appropriate.
